This Page: The Palace of Darius is one of the most elegantly built—yet strong—palaces in Persepolis. Twelve columns supported the roof of the central hall from which three small stairways descend. Figures on these stairways depict servants traversing the steps carrying animals and food to be served at the king's tables. There are several carvings of Darius at this palace as well.
